

The Journal of the Canadian Chiropractic Association (JCCA) has established an Award of Excellence with respect to manuscripts published in the Journal in order to acknowledge and more fully recognize the contributions of authors, clinicians and researchers to advancing the scholarly literature of the profession. The relevant time period for this cycle includes the years 1996, 1997 and 1998. This is the second three-year cycle of awards presented.

Awards to authors may be given in each of the three categories. In each category the award is presented to the author(s) of the paper “making a significant contribution to the knowledge base on which chiropractic rests”. The editor selected a subcommittee of editorial board members (Dr. A. Grice, Dr. R. Gitelman and Dr. P. Côté) to serve as an independent panel of raters. The panel was instructed to apply the test of “significant contribution” to the 48 papers and to nominate 2 papers in each category.
